General Changes: Most changes are grammatical changes or updates to wording to allow for better flow of what the statement is supposed to imply. Major changes described below.

Change:

3. Licensed for personal, noncommercial use only.

Why: Clarifying that Products associated with Footnote 3 are not licensed for commercial use.

Where: Footnote 21

Change:

21. Customer may build Value-Added Applications for use by Customer's Named Users. Customer may not (i) embed Named User Credentials in Value-Added Applications or (ii) embed or use App Login Credentials in Value-Added Applications. Customer may permit (a) public access to Value-Added Applications without credentials or (b) access using unique, individual Named User login credentials. See Master Agreement http://www.esri.com/legal/software-license for additional terms of use for Named User Licenses.

Why: Terms and conditions specific to Named Users have been moved to the body of the Master Agreement.

Where: Footnote 30

Change:

30. Use is restricted to a maximum of 10 gigabytes of Customer's data. All components must be installed on a single server.

Why: Licenses are intended for a single server.

Where: Footnote 77

Change:

77. <u>Includes a Commercial App Deployment license</u>, <u>which enables</u> Customer <u>mayto</u> make Value-Added Applications available to third parties for a fee.

Why: Commercial App Deployment license is defined in the Master Agreement. This footnote now clarifies that products associated with Footnote 77 include this type of license.
